Don't Spread the Love

As pet owners, one of the most important decisions we can make for the health and well-being of our animals is the decision to have them spayed or neutered.

The benefits of these procedures not only can vastly increase the length of life of your pet, but also the quality of his or her life. Spaying helps prevent uterine infections and cancer of the mammary glands, especially in females that are spayed before their first heat cycle.

In addition, neutering in males prevents testicular cancer and prostate problems.

All of these conditions are potentially fatal and can significantly shorten the lifespan of your pet. Intact males and females are also more likely to try to escape their homes in order to find a potential mate, taking risks those that are altered may not. This can lead to unwanted pregnancies, fights among animals, and even animals being hit by cars.

Unaltered animals are also much more likely to inappropriately urinate or mark their territory (your home) with strong smelling urine.

The cost of a spay or neuter is ultimately a very small price to pay for preventing over population and for the long term health and happiness of any animal in your care.
