resolutions. Step one of any animal weight loss program is to consult your Veterinarian for an assessment to not only set up a safe and attainable weight loss regimen, but to also ensure that there is no underlying reason for sudden weight gain. These conditions may include hormonal conditions such as hypothyroidism or Cushing's syndrome. Upon assessment, your veterinarian will suggest a food formulated to be lower in calories, and a meal plan to ensure that this food is fed in the correct amount. During this time, it's important to have your pet weighed monthly to verify that the weight loss program is working. It is also essential during this time to ensure that your animal is receiving a proper amount of exercise. For our dog friends, this can mean increasing the duration or speed of their walks or play time. For our cat friends, we suggest having a set time to play with their favourite toy or placing a measured amount of dry food in a treat ball so energy is expended on a daily basis. Another important factor of weight loss is the amount of treats given. Unless otherwise directed, treats should be avoided or given in very small amounts to ensure that no extra calories are consumed that aren't being accounted for in the meal plan. We hope you and your furry friends enjoy a happy and healthy 2020.
