Don't You Put It In Your Mouth

With the holidays fast approaching, many of us are eager to begin decorating our homes. For some, this include decking the halls with festive plants. Many of these plants can be toxic to our canine and feline friends. Some may cause gastric upset when ingested, while others can be fatal. Poinsettia leaves for example, when ingested, can cause nausea and vomiting. If the plant is treated with a pesticide these reactions can be much more severe, especially in young animals.

Holly and mistletoe have an even higher toxicity level than poinsettia plants if ingested (whether it is the berry or leaves) and can cause severe gastrointestinal upset, a severe drop in blood pressure, and difficulty breathing.

Christmas trees can also present a health risk, not only in regards to ornaments and lights, but also the ingestion of pine leaves that can cause an obstruction or puncture in the gastrointestinal tract. This knowledge will help to make sure everyone has a safe and healthy holiday.


